Come as You Are:

BMoA Celebrates Self Expression and Community During National Pride Month with Photography
Exhibition and Art After Dark

June 6, 2023 – Bakersfield Museum of Art (BMoA) celebrates creativity and self-expression during National Pride Month with a pop-up photography exhibition and its popular Art After Dark event.

The celebration begins Thursday, June 8 at 5 PM with the opening of *Faces of Pride: an LGBTQ+ Photography Project*. Inspired by a similar exhibition that premiered in Boston, photographer Jake Tovar, a Bakersfield native, captured portraits of members of the local queer and ally community. As part of the exhibition, each subject answers the question "What does Pride mean to you" in their own words.

"Portraiture has a rich tradition, from documentation in ancient Egypt to artistic expression in the 20th century through today. This exhibition documents the inherent freedom in and value of self-expression," said BMoA Curator of Exhibitions and Collections Victor Gonzales.

"The BMoA community has at its core a passion for the visual arts, a pursuit that binds us all as human beings," says Rogers Brandon, Chairperson of BMoA's board of directors and president of American General Media. *Faces of Pride*, presented by Dignity Health Bakersfield, will be on view at BMoA through July 1.

Continuing the celebration is BMoA's signature Art After Dark event on Thursday, June 29 from 7 PM to 10 PM at BMoA. Guests can enjoy live performances by artists from the LGBTQ+ community including sets by DJ Blaise and participate in a mural painting project led by local artist Jennifer Williams Cordova. Food will be available for purchase from local food trucks and artisanal cotton candy purveyor LUVSPUN. Moo Creamery will provide hand-crafted cocktails and mocktails throughout the evening.

Guests can also tour the exhibitions <u>Rotem Reshef: Vista</u>, <u>The Circle of Sam Francis: Experimenting in California</u>, <u>Saturation: Visual Arts Festival</u>, <u>Nostalgia: Selections from the Students of the ArtWorks Program</u>, and <u>Dynamic Surreal</u>, <u>Vibrant: Marion Osborne Cunningham</u>.
